4 This Act may be cited as the "Finding and Inves-5 tigating Native Disappearance Act" or the "FIND Act".

1SEC. 2. STUDY AND REPORT ON REPORTING OF MISSING2INDIANS AND EFFECTS OF THE USE OF3METHAMPHETAMINE AND OTHER ILLEGAL4DRUGS.

5 (a) DEFINITION OF INDIAN.—In this section, the
6 term "Indian" has the meaning given the term in section
7 4 of the Indian Child Welfare Act of 1978 (25 U.S.C.
8 1903).

9 (b) STUDY AND REPORT.—Not later than 180 days 10 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Comptroller 11 General of the United States shall conduct, and submit 12 to Congress a report describing the results of, a study 13 on—

14 (1) ways to increase reporting of missing Indi-15 ans; and
