## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Yellowstone Gateway
- 5 Protection Act".

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## 1 SEC. 2. WITHDRAWAL.

2 (a) DEFINITION OF MAP.—In this section, the term 3 "map" means the map entitled "Emigrant Crevice Proposed Withdrawal Area" and dated November 10, 2016. 4 5 (b) WITHDRAWAL.—Subject to valid existing rights in existence on the date of enactment of this Act, the Na-6 7 tional Forest System land and interests in the National 8 Forest System land, as depicted on the map, is withdrawn 9 from-10 (1) location, entry, and patent under the mining 11 laws; and 12 (2) disposition under all laws pertaining to min-13 eral and geothermal leasing. 14 (c) ACQUIRED LAND.—Any land or interest in land within the area depicted on the map that is acquired by 15 16 the United States after the date of enactment of this Act shall, on acquisition, be immediately withdrawn in accord-17 ance with this section. 18 19 (d) MAP.— 20 (1) SUBMISSION OF MAP.—As soon as prac-21 ticable after the date of enactment of this Act, the 22 Secretary of Agriculture shall file the map with— 23 (A) the Committee on Energy and Natural 24 Resources of the Senate; and 25 (B) the Committee on Natural Resources 26 of the House of Representatives.

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(2) FORCE OF LAW.—The map filed under
 paragraph (1) shall have the same force and effect
 as if included in this Act, except that the Secretary
 of Agriculture may correct clerical and typographical
 errors in the map.

6 (3) PUBLIC AVAILABILITY.—The map filed 7 under paragraph (1) shall be on file and available 8 for public inspection in the appropriate offices of the 9 Forest Service and the Bureau of Land Manage-10 ment.

(e) EFFECT.—Nothing in this section affects any recreational use, including hunting or fishing, that is authorized on land within the area depicted on the map under
applicable law as of the date of enactment of this Act.
