 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Guard Pro-
 - 5 motion Accountability Act".

1	SEC. 2. DATE OF RANK OF COMMISSIONED NATIONAL
2	GUARD OFFICERS PROMOTED TO A HIGHER
3	GRADE.
4	(a) In General.—Section 14308(f) of title 10,
5	United States Code, is amended—
6	(1) by inserting "(1)" before "The effective
7	date";
8	(2) in paragraph (1), as designated by para-
9	graph (1) of this subsection, by striking "on which
10	such Federal recognition in that grade is so ex-
11	tended" and inserting "of the approval of the pro-
12	motion of the officer to that grade by the State con-
13	cerned"; and
14	(3) by adding at the end the following new
15	paragraph:
16	"(2)(A) Notwithstanding subsection (c)(1), the date
17	of rank in a higher grade of an officer whose effective date
18	of promotion to such grade is governed by paragraph (1)
19	shall be such effective date of promotion.
20	"(B) The specification of the date of rank of an offi-
21	cer in a grade pursuant to subparagraph (A) shall be
22	deemed an adjustment of the date of rank of the officer
23	to that grade in the manner of section 741(d)(4) of this
24	title, pursuant to subsection (e)(2), to which section
25	741(d)(4)(C) of this title shall apply, notwithstanding sub-
26	section $(e)(3)$.".

(b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
subsection (a) shall take effect on the date of the enact-
ment of this Act, and shall apply with respect to National
Guard officers whose promotion to a grade is approved
by a State after that date.
SEC. 3. NOTICE TO CONGRESS ON DELAY IN PUBLICATION
OF SCROLLS INDICATING PROMOTION OF
COMMISSIONED NATIONAL GUARD OFFI-
CERS.
(a) Notice Required.—If at the end of the 200-
day period beginning on the receipt by the Department
of the Army or the Department of the Air Force of a scroll
indicating the promotion of commissioned officers in the
Army National Guard or Air National Guard, as applica-
ble, the scroll has not been published by the military de-
partment concerned, the Secretary of the Army or the Sec-
retary of the Air Force, as the case may be, shall imme-
diately notify the congressional defense committees, in
writing, of the following:
(1) The date on which the scroll was so re-
ceived.
(2) A description of the processing of the scroll
by the military department concerned as of the date
of the report, including a statement of the length of

3	(3) The reason why the scroll was not published
4	within 200 days of receipt, and the intended remedi-
5	ation for the delay in publication.
