A BILL

To amend the Homeowner Flood Insurance Affordability Act of 2014 to address ecosystem restoration projects, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Floodplain Enhance-
- 5 ment and Recovery Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. ECOSYSTEM RESTORATION PROJECTS.
- 7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 22 of the Homeowner
- 8 Flood Insurance Affordability Act of 2014 (42 U.S.C.
- 9 4101e) is amended to read as follows:

- 2 "(a) Definition.—In this section, the term 'eco-3 system restoration project' means a project proposed for the primary purpose of manipulating the physical, chem-4 5 ical, or biological characteristics of a site with the goal of— 6 7 "(1) recovering natural and beneficial functions 8 to a former or degraded aquatic resource or flood-9 plain; or 10 "(2) enhancing, accelerating, reclaiming, or im-11 proving a specific, natural, and beneficial function of 12 an aquatic resource or floodplain. 13 "(b) Exemption From Fees for Flood Hazard Change Requests for Ecosystem Restoration Projects.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a requester shall be exempt from submitting a review or processing fee for a request for a flood insurance rate map 17 18 change based on an ecosystem restoration project. 19 "(c) Exemption From Conditional Approval FOR CERTAIN ECOSYSTEM RESTORATION PROJECTS.—A 21 community may permit an ecosystem restoration project within an adopted regulatory floodway that would result 23 in an increase in base flood elevations, if—
- 24 "(1) a professional engineer uses the best judg-25 ment of the engineer to determine that the cumu-26 lative effect of the proposed ecosystem restoration

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- project, when combined with all other existing development, will not increase the water surface elevation of the base flood by more than 1 foot (or a greater amount or metric determined appropriate by the Administrator);
 - "(2) no insurable structure or any critical infrastructure is located in an area that would be adversely impacted by the increased base flood elevation; and
 - "(3) not later than 180 days after the date on which the ecosystem restoration project is completed, the community submits to the Administrator an analysis regarding the changed conditions caused by the ecosystem restoration project.
- "(d) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this section may be construed to affect the procedure (as in effect on the day before the date of enactment of the Floodplain Enhancement and Recovery Act) for providing notification to a landowner with respect to development in a regulatory floodway.".
- 21 (b) Technical and Conforming Amendment.—
- 22 The table of contents for the Homeowner Flood Insurance
- 23 Affordability Act of 2014 (Public Law 113–89) is amend-
- 24 ed by striking the item relating to section 22 and inserting
- 25 the following:

4	istrator" means the Administrator of the Fed-
5	eral Emergency Management Agency.
6	(B) COVERED AGENCIES.—The term "cov-
7	ered agencies" means Federal and State nat-
8	ural resource agencies, as determined by the
9	Administrator.
10	(2) Issuance.—Not later than 180 days after
11	the date of enactment of this Act, and after con-
12	sultation with the heads of covered agencies, the Ad-
13	ministrator shall issue guidance to implement sec-
14	tion 22 of the Homeowner Flood Insurance Afford-
15	ability Act of 2014 (42 U.S.C. 4101e), as amended
16	by this section.
